Describe your liturgical style and practice for all types of worship services provided by your community.

We provide two Sunday services. The 8am service uses Rite I in a spoken format without organ accompaniment or hymns. The 10am service uses Rite II with musical accompaniment and hymns. Both services include the Eucharist, lessons, Gospel, and sermon.

How do you practice incorporating others in ministry?

St. Paul's has dedicated EM's who actively participate in the provision of the sacrament to shut ins, lead the prayers of the church at services, and in conjunction with lay riders, offer the weekly readings.

As a worshipping community, how do you care for your spiritual, emotional and physical well-being?

We support each other's need in all of the above ways — individually or together as needed. Our community is tight knit and we are able to openly discuss with each other the areas of our lives where we need support. During COVID, and without a Rector, the EMs made home calls, the Supply Priest made home and hospital visits, and we established a telephone tree for Sunday mornings.

How do you engage in pastoral care for those beyond your worshipping community?

We began during the pandemic to create YouTube services for our local community, not assuming it would go any further. We have been amazed that this ministry has gone much further including Europe. Today we are still getting hits on the videos we created six months to a year ago as people continue to discover our YouTube channel.

Describe your worshipping community's involvement in either the wider Church or geographical region.

We are involved with Rural and Migrant Ministry, CropWalk, and Food Pantry among our ministries that touch the local and wider areas. Pre-pandemic there were Ecumenical services in Pleasant Valley that we contributed to. One of our Wardens has been lifted up as an Application for Ordination to the Diaconate; she is also our representative to Convention.

Tell about a ministry that your worshipping community has initiated in the past five years. Who can be contacted about this?

Friday Night Prayer Worship is a small group of parishioners who gather for an hour or so to end the work week with prayer. They often use Compline as an outline for their service. Liz Whitman organized this group about five years ago and made a prayer box for the back of the church where parishioners can leave their intentions for the group.

What is your practice of stewardship and how does it shape the life of your worshipping community?

Our Stewardship campaign revolves around October-November testimonials, articles in the Damascus newsletter, and the Warden's letter. It is a six week campaign during which we show the many sides of stewardship including giving of your time and talents to, finally, giving of your money.

What is your worshipping community's experience of conflict? And how have you addressed it?

We are a community with varied demographics. Conflicts are inherent in any group. When they arise, we discuss, debate, and pray until an answer presents itself. It isn't easy to resolve every conflict but we do keep in mind that we all want the best for St. Paul's.

What is your experience leading/addressing change in the church? When has it gone well? When has it gone poorly? And what did you learn?

Change happens slowly at St. Paul's. St.Paul's is in general an older parish where many new ideas or technology are slow to be accepted. It isn't just the parishioners, it is also the community around St. Paul's. We offer to accept credit cards for fundraisers but most in the community would still rather pay with cash. Acceptance happens with any new idea a bit at a time. Slow and steady is the watchword.
