COVID has created challenges but has not deterred us. In fact, it has made us a stronger, more caring and connected community closer to each other and to our God.

How are you preparing yourselves for the Church of the future?

COVID has made the Church of the future a reality now. Preparing for the post pandemic world is critical for any institution but particularly for a worship community. We have the dual challenge of simultaneously ministering to a community past the shock of the pandemic and now dealing with the ways all have been impacted by isolation, remote schooling, employment concerns and the resulting questions of economic security and desperate physical and spiritual need as well as manage it all with limited resources. Add to that the challenge of maintaining and growing our community and the need for a realistic plan now becomes quite clear.

Describe your liturgical style and practice for all types of worship services provided by your community.

CTK values the richness of the Anglican tradition as we seek to open hearts and minds to God present in us, in the Eucharist and in our world. We strive for a “relaxed” catholic worship style that is deep, meaningful and focused on Christ. When our deacon dismisses us we know that we are being sent into the world to serve Christ in all people. Our 8 a.m. Sunday Eucharist is well attended, quiet and simple. At 10 our choir (including 2 paid section leaders) leads us in beautiful music and hymns from diverse traditions. Children sing about once a month. Our choral Eucharist includes texts from the BCP and other approved supplemental sources. We observe All Saints with a choral evensong and all the proper liturgies of Holy Week are celebrated. Our Great Vigil of Easter begins before dawn in the garth (memorial garden) and proceeds to the church as we proclaim the light of Christ in our midst. We also offer a healing service on Wednesdays in the Beth Lewis Parlor. Brunch often follows our Sunday services and most stay to eat and catch up with one another.

How do you practice incorporating others in ministry?

CTK is defined by its talented and active congregation. With limited paid staff we depend on the unique experience, energy and commitment we each bring to our community. The core ministries for any vibrant community as well as the aspirational ones that make a congregation special are all staffed and managed by volunteers. We work together to address each challenge and create new opportunities.

As a worshipping community, how do you care for your spiritual, emotional and physical well-being?

As a family-sized congregation in a residential area of the Mid-Hudson we have the advantage of knowing each other. What is special though is that there is a genuine caring and natural outreach to anyone in need. Led by the rector and deacon, response to those in need is swift but low key always respectful of the dignity each of us holds in God’s eyes.

How do you engage in pastoral care for those beyond your worshipping community?

CTK is an open and inviting community. Anyone seeking a community of faith is welcome. We also support distant ministries to the extent our budget and resources allow.

Describe your worshipping community's involvement in either the wider Church or geographical region.

CTK is deeply involved in the greater community. The Rondout Valley Food Pantry started in the rector's garage and has now grown into a major source of support for those in the area in need. CTK has an active social justice commitment -a committed group involved both within the parish community and in the greater Hudson Valley. CTK strongly and actively supports both the LGBTQ and migrant worker communities ministering to them but also standing with them in petitioning for their rights. Currently our largest and most active group (undeterred by the challenges of COVID) is our Racial Justice Committee. They have sponsored book groups, movies, discussions and advocacy as we seek to become anti-racists.

What is your practice of stewardship and how does it shape the life of your worshipping community?

Stewardship is a priority and is woven firmly into the culture of our community. Making budget, as is the case for most nonprofits particularly worship communities, is never easy. But the people of CTK are generous, willing and want to support what they consider an inseparable part of their identity.

---

What is your worshipping community's experience of conflict? And how have you addressed it?

Conflict is unavoidable in a vibrant community. The absence of conflict is often a more dangerous sign than any outright disagreement. The key is to identify it, talk about it and carefully resolve it with a mutual respect for each other. At CTK a direct approach combined with prayerful discernment asking for God's guidance and intercession is part of dealing any conflict.

What is your experience leading/addressing change in the church? When has it gone well? When has it gone poorly? And what did you learn?

CTK is a family. Respect for each other and especially for our differences is key. Praying and asking for God's help at navigating through the unknown and uncomfortable is core. Taking time allowing each member to adjust and absorb at their own pace also helps. When we have done these things we have succeeded. When we haven't it's been a challenge and learning experience.
