St. Peter's Episcopal Church, a welcoming, loving, and community-engaged parish in Peekskill, New York, is seeking a part-time Music Director & Organist to lead and support the musical life of the congregation.

This musician will work closely with the Rector to provide music leadership for the parish's principal Sunday liturgy, direct the choir during the program year, and support a worship life that is grounded, collaborative, and well-prepared. The parish has a stable foundation for music ministry and is looking for someone who can sustain that work well and build on it over time. The position ordinarily includes one Sunday service and one choir rehearsal each week during the program year. The regular Sunday service is at 10:00 a.m. during the program year and 9:00 a.m. in the summer (Memorial Day through Labor Day). The choir does not rehearse or sing during the summer.

The ideal candidate will be:

- proficient in both organ and piano
- experienced in church music and liturgical leadership
- comfortable collaborating in the Episcopal tradition
- organized, reliable, and communicative
- able to support congregational singing confidently and sensitively
- skilled in leading a choir and working with volunteer singers and musicians

The parish's instruments include a pipe organ and piano, both in excellent condition and regularly used and maintained.

This is a part-time salaried position with a salary range of \$20,000-\$25,000, commensurate with experience. The start date is negotiable. Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis until the position is filled.

St. Peter's is conveniently located in the City of Peekskill and is accessible via the Hudson Line of Metro-North Railroad.
